A PROFILE

Govt. Degree College Udhampur was set up in 1961. The first batch of 30 students was admitted on 27th June, 1961. The majestic campus of this decades' old college is situated at the outskirts of Udhampur town on a hillock overlooking the Devika, the sacred Ganges of Jammu region. Since its inception the college has achieved major landmarks and is at present one of the leading institutions of higher learning in the State of Jammu and Kashmir. This college has recently been upgraded as Govt. College eligible to teach up to Masters Degree level by the UGC vide order no. 8-595/2011 (CPP-1/C) dated 23rd Jan, 2012. It has also been selected for prestigious Star College Scheme by the Dept. of Biotechnology, Govt. of India.

At present, the College offer courses in the disciplines of Arts, Commerce, Science (Medical and Non-medical), BCA and BBA. We also offer three PG Courses i.e. PG Chemistry, PG English & PG Hindi. From the academic session 2018-2019, some new subjects are also granted affiliation by Jammu University to run the courses viz., Chemistry at PG level and Philosophy, Functional English & Geology at UG level. A sizable section of students joining this institution comes from such families that mainly depend on agriculture and are economically as well as socially weak. The College carefully caters to the educational needs of this particular section of the society and puts in every effort to ensure a gradual and meaningful development of the students, both in curricular and extracurricular domains. Adding new initiatives and commitment for students at large, placement drives are being organized. A sizable number of experts from corporate world are visiting the college campus under Project UDAAN every year.

The College has a highly qualified and experienced staff, well-equipped laboratories, rich library, play-fields, Boys' hostel, Multi-purpose hall, Conference hall, Smart Classrooms, Edu-sat and other infrastructural facilities. In a first of its kind in the Government colleges of the J&K state, college has set up a **Virtual class room** for initiating innovation in teaching with the digital revolution so as to provide the best available knowledge and information to the students for technology based 'intuitive learning'. Besides, the lush green splendid campus of the College equipped with all basic amenities (with a back drop of the Gangeda Hills) provides ample reasons of attraction and a conducive environment for optimum learning to the students. To cater to the transport needs, the college has two dedicated buses for the girl students.

GENERAL RULES

- No outsider is allowed to enter the College without a valid reason.
- All students have to be in specified uniform as shown below:
 - **Boys (UG)**: White Shirt-Black formal Trousers in Summers & Black formal Coat or V-neck sweater in Winters.
 - **Boys(PG):** Sky Blue Shirt-Black formal Trousers in Summers & Black formal Coat or V-neck sweaters in Winters.
 - **Girls (UG)**: Simple White Salwar- Kameez & White Chunni with Black Sweater in Winters (without any designs & hood) or formal Black Coat-Trousers with white shirt.
 - **Girls(PG)**: Simple Pinkish Purple Kameez with White Salwar & White Chunni with Black Sweater (without any designs & hood) or formal Black Coat-Trousers with White Shirt.

Note: However, Principal of the College may exempt white Kameez –Salwar & chunni & allow Pink Kameez – Salwar & Chunni instead to a girl student who is married or engaged for marriage on the written request of the Parent/s or Guardians. Denims are not allowed at all. All the students will all carry I-Cards every day.

- If a student remains absent from the College for more than fourteen consecutive days, his/her name shall be struck off the College rolls.
- Use of Mobile is strictly banned.
- Unlawful assembly of students is banned.
- Writing of graffiti or sticking of posters and spitting on walls is a cognizable offence.
- Ragging in any form on or off the college campus including the hostel is a cognizable offence and the student/students involved in ragging will be severely punished as provided in IPC and Hon'ble Supreme Court directions.
- Disciplinary action will be initiated against a student resorting to unfair means in the Internal Examination.
- A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the College rolls should submit an application, countersigned by his parents/guardians. The relevant certificate shall be issued only after the student clears all college dues. Such student shall, in no case be re-admitted during the same or the next academic session.
- As per Govt. Order No. HE Gen 61/2001 dated: 07-09-2001, fee once deposited will not be refunded.
- For the current year, girl students shall be admitted only for those subjects those are not offered in GCW, Udhampur.
- The entry into **College Vatika** shall be restricted to girl students only.
- The Bus fee charged from the girl students at the time of admission is compulsory and non refundable.
- The above rules are subject to change modification or suspension as and when required.

• The decision of the College Principal, in any matter, shall be final and binding.

CAMPUS LIFE

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College has a Literary/Cultural Club which organizes debates, symposia, quiz contests and seminars. The Literary Club arranges literary programmes, lectures, talks of academic interest and essay competition.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS

The College has a splendid playground for Cricket, Football, Hockey, Tennis, Volley-ball, Kabaddi and Badminton. Games are played regularly and every student is expected to play at least one game. Students can have the usual equipment for the games he/she opts for.

- After the completion of the admission process, the College teams are announced on the basis of trials and selection process. The players in their own interest are advised to be punctual and regular in their class work as well.
- Inter-group tournaments in all the games are conducted periodically. Mementoes and prizes are given to the winning groups.
- Extraordinary players are considered for awards which cannot be claimed as a matter of right but are decided by the competent authority on the basis of overall performance of the players in and outside the field.
- Special arrangements have been made for indoor games in which the members of the staff as well as students can participate.
- Members of various teams must report punctually for practice and for matches. Absentees will be fined. There will be a special fine for absence from the matches. Any player who indulges in any kind of indiscipline in the College shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate or college colors. All games will be played after 1.00 p.m.
- The college organizes State Level Annual Governor's Silver Rolling Volleyball Trophy for Men and Women.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS

To inculcate a sense of discipline among the youth and to develop their character, the ideal of service, capacity for leadership and a spirit of comradeship, the College provide facilities for N.C.C training to the volunteer students. This also aims at providing service and adventure training to the youth so as to stimulate their interest in the defense of the country and also to build up a reserve of manpower for the Armed Forces. Many of our cadets are serving the Forces in various capacities.

Two wings of NCC Infantry are there, namely:

- 1) Senior Division (Boys) 80 Seats
- 2) Senior Division (Girls) 50 Seats

The NCC cadets are trained under the guidance of Major Kamal Kishore and Lt. Kamaldeep Kour Associate NCC Officers of the college.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF NCC

- Every enrolled NCC cadet shall have to undergo two parades of two- hour duration each in a week and is required to attend at least 40 parades in a year.
- All cadets shall have to put in 75% attendance at parades so as to become eligible for certificate exams.
- Enrolled cadets will have to attend at least one camp.
- Uniform issued to the cadets is to be used with great care. The uniforms are to be returned at the
 end of academic session to the concerned officers failing which permission will not be accorded to
 appear in the University examination.
- 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations are held annually for cadets in 2nd and 3rd year of NCC training respectively.
- Misbehavior and misconduct in NCC activities as adjudged by Associate NCC Officers can debar a cadet from appearing in the University examination.
- Enrolled students are covered by insurance against any mishap during the training period.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

- To foster a spirit of comradeship and love for humanity in general and rural folk in particular, facilities are provided to volunteers with a desire for social service to put in their best for alleviating the sufferings of the sick, the helpless and the down-trodden.
- The NSS squads work under the able guidance of Prof Samosh Kumar and Dr. Rippy Bawa (NSS Programme Officers) who guide them and chalk out programmes for voluntary social service.
- The College has two units of NSS, each consisting of 100 volunteers. Each unit functions under a Programme Officer. The students have to apply on a prescribed form for seeking admission to a unit.
- Students enrolled as NSS volunteers are required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one ten-day camp to become eligible to receive a certificate.
- Besides regular camp at college level, a special camp at University level and a national Integration Camp are also organized every year during summer and winter vacations.

A Lifelong Learning Club Jigyasa organizes many activities of significance for the youth like computer literacy, skill enhancement, brainstorming etc. This Club works in association with many other organizations working with the mission of skill development of the youth & social upliftment of the underprivileged classes. This unit has been conducting DST sponsored computer literacy program for the students every year for the last seven years. This course is certified by NIELIT (DOEACC). Awareness & Life Skill Programs are also organized by this Club.

TOUR AND PICNICS

Picnics, educational and subject tours, hiking and trekking expeditions are also organized from time to time.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College library is housed in a newly constructed spacious building. It has more than 56,000 books on various subjects. Ours is a rich library where there is no dearth of latest books concerning the syllabi which are issued to the students under rules. Latest Magazines, Periodicals and Newspapers are displayed in the Reading room. Students are encouraged to make proper use of this facility in their free time. The IT-enabled reading room provides internet facility to the students.

LIBRARY RULES

- Books will be issued to a student on production of Library Borrower's Card which is issued to him/her at the start of the academic session by the librarian.
- Books lost or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrowers failing which double
 the cost of a book shall be charged. The borrower should satisfy himself/herself about the sound

condition of the book before leaving the counter. Books are issued for a period of 14 days only and a fine of Re. 1/- per book per day shall be charged after the due date for first 15 days and thereafter Rs 2/- per day.

- Reference books and current periodicals are not issued for use at home. However, these can be consulted within the library premises.
- Undergraduate students can borrow two books from the library. P.G. students are allowed to borrow three books at a time.
- Strict silence is to be observed in the Library and Reading rooms Students shall not take their personal books or belongings inside the library.

IDENTITY CUM LIBRARY CARD

- Every student on being admitted, shall be issued an Identity Card which he/she will carry on his/her person at all times and shall produce on demand, by any member of the College staff, anywhere in the College premises.
- Students appearing for the University examination shall surrender their library card/borrower's cards before receiving Roll No. slip in Semester-II, IV & VI. Students failing to surrender their cards at that time shall be fined @ Rs. 125/- per student.
- The loss of the Identity Card should be reported immediately to the concerned authority.
- A new Identity Card shall not ordinarily be issued. However after proper verification a duplicate Identity Card may be issued on a payment of Rs. 125/- as fine.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

There is a provision of scholarships for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Low Income groups, Other Social Castes, RBA, Frontier and Handicapped students. National Loan Scholarships and National Scholarships are awarded by the Government of India. Besides these, merit scholarships are also awarded to the deserving students by Jammu University. Over and above these scholarships, liberal help is given to the deserving students out of the Mutual Benefit Fund augmented by the State Government grants and UGC Funds. The college also recommends deserving eligible students for Post – matric scholarship given by Dept. of Social Welfare.

The grant and continuance of the scholarships is subject to the following conditions:

- Regular attendance
- Satisfactory conduct
- Production of Income Certificate
- Attested copy of the State Subject Certificate.

Scholarships shall be drawn only for the following period:-

- (a) Academic Session
- (b) Sanctioned holidays and Sundays
- (c) Permissible Leave

A student applying for scholarships is required to submit an application on a prescribed form which can be had from the College office. The students are advised to keep them updated regarding the notices about scholarships.

The income certificate of the father/ guardian should be issued by the Revenue Officer of the rank not less than the rank of Tehsildar. Parent/Guardian of the student applying for any scholarship must give an undertaking that in case his/her ward participates in strikes or any other subversive activity he/she will refund the amount of the scholarship received in one installment.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

- Hostel facility is available for 100 male students in two Boys' Hostels, i.e., Tagore Hostel and Gaddi Sippy Hostel. Three students are accommodated in a room.
- ❖ Regarding admission, preference is given to the meritorious students, candidates coming from flung areas and those belonging to SC/ST, Back ward classes and backward areas. Some seats are reserved for the children of Defence Personnel. Admission in Gaddi Sippy Hostel is preferred to Gaddi Sippy community. The hostel functions under the supervision of the Warden who is guardian of all the inmates of the hostel.
- Students desiring admission to the hostel must apply on the prescribed form attached at the end of Prospectus. The applications are properly scrutinized and the shortlisted candidates are interviewed by the Hostel Admission Committee. Selected candidates shall pay the dues in full before they report to the Warden. No one is admitted before completing the necessary formalities. No hosteller shall be allowed to remain in the hostel if his monthly dues are not paid within 15 days from the date of announcement unless specially authorized by the Principal.
- ❖ Resident students will be required to sign receipts for items of furniture and other things issued to them. They will be responsible for any damage done to the hostel property. While leaving the hostel at the end of the term every student should hand over the charge of furniture of his room to the Hostel Warden. There is a Reading Room also where daily newspapers are available regularly. Meals are served in the Dining Hall only. No one is allowed to have meals in his room. Concession however may be made in the case of a boarder who is ill. The hostel mess is run on co-operative basis and is managed by the Mess Committee comprising students and the Warden.
- Students have to clear the mess charges by the 10th of each month.
- ❖ The hostel gates are opened at 5 a.m. in summer and at 6 a.m. in winter and are closed at 10 p.m. in summer and 9 p.m. in winter. Gates shall not be opened during the night except in case of emergency. No boarder shall be allowed to move out after the evening attendance is taken.
- ❖ Application for leave should be submitted to the Warden in person Boarders who remain absent without prior admission are liable to be expelled from the hostel. Any boarder staying away for the whole night without permission shall be fined Rs. 100/- for the first offence. If the offence is repeated second time, the fine will be doubled, third time he is liable to face disciplinary action which can include expulsion from the hostel.

- ❖ No guests/ relatives are allowed to reside in the hostel. Visitors are not allowed to enter the hostel. They are allowed only in the visitor's lounge. If this rule is broken the boarder is liable to be fined or expelled from the hostel.
- ❖ The hostlers are themselves responsible for the safety of their belongings. During vacations and long leave they shall remove all personal property from the premises of the hostel. The articles left in the premises without permission may be confiscated.
- ❖ The hostel authorities shall not be responsible for the loss or theft of any cash or valuables kept in the rooms of the boarders.
- Religious meetings, gatherings or functions are not allowed inside the hostel premises. No boarder is allowed to observe any religious ceremony even in his own room.
- ❖ No boarder is allowed any amusement which may disturb other boarders.
- Playing outdoor games in the corridors is prohibited.

Ragging in the hostel is strictly prohibited. Any student of the hostel indulging in ragging shall be strictly dealt with under rules.

- If a hostler is asked to vacate the hostel room on disciplinary or administrative grounds, he shall have to obey immediately, failing which the Warden shall break open the lock of the room and remove the belongings
- ❖ Any refundable dues shall be released only after all due payments have been made by the boarder. The claim for all such refunds should be made within six months from the date of leaving the hostel. No claim shall be entertained after that.
- Hostel fee and mess charges should be paid in advance.
- ♦ Hostel Fee and hostel security deposit is Rs. 2500/- + Rs 1000/- = Rs 3500/- per student.
- ❖ For hostel dues, students have to contact the Warden.
- ❖ Failures will not be provided room/rooms in the hostel.
- Use of Heaters/Electric appliances in the rooms is strictly banned.

The College authorities reserve the right to alter, amend or modify any of the existing rules without prior notice. Decision of the Principal in all the matters shall be final and binding.

COUNSELLING

The college has arrangements for counselling of students especially for freshers.
 Guidance is provided by the experienced faculty to prevent ragging. Special anti - ragging squads are constituted for this purpose.

- Students are provided career counselling and necessary information for proper development, growth and placement.
- Emotional counselling is provided by senior faculty so that students overcome stress, tension and emotional problems and think positively for the overall development.

The Statutes/Scheme governing Choice Based Credit System at the under Graduate Level

CBCS PROGRAMME STRUCTURE REGULATIONS

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising **core**, **elective or skill based courses**.

Core Course: A course, which needs to be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

Project Work/Dissertation: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses (SEC)/Foundation Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC)/Skill Enhancement Course (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They include ((i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication). These are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

AE Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

AE Elective Course (AEEC)/SEC: These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 2/4 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

CREDITS DISTRIBUTION

Courses having theory and practicals may incorporate 4 credits for theory paper and 2 credits for practicals (In case total credits are 6) and 2 credits for theory paper and 2 credits for practicals (In case total credits are 4) while courses having only practicals may have 2/4 credits as per the course requirement. Purely theory courses may incorporate 4 credits for theory and 2 credits for tutorials.

NOMENCLATURE OF UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

Nomenclature of courses shall be done in such a way that the course code shall consist of eight characters:

- ن The first character "**U**" stands for Under Graduate
- Next two characters will denote the course code
- Next character will signify the nature of the course(**T** for Theory, **P** for practical, **D** for project, **U** for tutorial)
- The succeeding character will denote whether the course is $Core(\mathbf{C})$, $Elective(\mathbf{E})$ or Skill/Ability $Enhancement(\mathbf{S})$
- The next character will denote the semester number
- Last two characters will denote the paper number

ADMISSION PROCESS UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

ADMISSION RULES

- ❖ A student who has passed Higher Secondary Part-II Examination (12th Class) of the J&K Board of School Education or an examination recognized as its equivalent by the University of Jammu is eligible for admission to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com/BCA/BBA SEM-I.
- The admission schedule is announced every year along with detailed information.
 Students seeking admission to B.A/B.Sc.P/B.Com SEM-I shall apply online. They should mention their choice of subject combinations in order of their preference as per the combinations available in the college.

CHANGE OF SUBJECT/STREAM IS NOT PERMISSIBLE AFTER ADMISSION.

- Selection list shall be drawn on the basis of merit i.e. marks obtained in class XIIth. *Mere mention in the Selection List does not entitle an applicant for admission.*
- ❖ Student belonging to the reserved categories as listed in SRO 294 dated 25-06-1994 shall get additional weightage of 5% marks (i.e. 30 marks out of total of 600), and these 30 marks shall be added to the total marks secured by the candidate provided he/she submits an attested copy of the valid relevant certificate issued by Competent Authority along with the application form. The selected candidates shall then fill in and submit the proper Admission Form. The online Print-outs duly signed by the parent/guardian in presence of Admission Committee shall be submitted to the College office on or before the last date. The applicants who do not submit the admission form with all the requisite certificates attached there with, or do not deposit the fee within time limit prescribed shall be dropped from the merit list and the next meritorious applicant shall be considered for admission Subject to the availability of seats, a second or third merit list may be displayed.
- Admission to the PG courses in Chemistry, English and Hindi is done by University of Jammu, University Entrance Test (JUET) followed by counseling.
 - ❖ A student, whose result is declared late by the J&K Board, may be admitted as per the Admission Rules of the University of Jammu, subject to the availability of seats. A student who is admitted in the

- College and completes the minimum required attendance but either fails or does not appear in the ensuing University examination, will not be considered for admission in the same class again.
- ❖ A science student falling short of attendance will be given casual admission to attend practicals to earn eligibility in case there is a vacancy in the concerned dept. He/she shall have to deposit Rs.1000/2000 depending upon the number of practicals he/she attends.
- A student with a break in academic career will not be considered for admission in the college.

 However, the Principal may condone one year break in case of a student where he feels convinced about the reason leading to the break in studies. This, too, is subject to the availability of seats.
- A student after having been admitted, if remains continuously absent for 14 days, shall be struck off the college rolls and shall not be re-admitted to the same class during the same year. The year so wasted shall be counted as one gap year and shall be dealt with under appropriate clauses if he/she presents himself/herself for re-admission.
- No applicant for B.A./B.Sc.P/B.Com/BCA/BBA SEM-I can take up Mathematics/Statistics as a subject unless he/she has qualified the Higher Secondary Part-II or equivalent examination with Mathematics as one of the subjects. The students applying for English Literature as subject shall have at least 50% marks in General English.
- ❖ Admission to a particular stream shall be made purely on merit basis as per availability of seats.

Admission to the different programmes of Under graduate courses shall be on the basis of merit subject to availability of seats

B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General) Programme

Admission to Semester-I of Three Year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General) Course shall be open to a candidate having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 Pattern) examination(in full subjects) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto subject to the availability of seats & if otherwise found eligible.

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Programme

Admission to Semester-I of the Three Year BBA Course, shall be open to a candidate who having passed Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination(in full subjects) of the J&K State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto and has obtained at least 50% of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination in case of General Category candidates and 45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates.

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) Programme

Admission to Semester-I of Three Year BCA Course shall be open to those candidates having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination of the J&K State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto with Mathematics as one of the elective subjects and has obtained atleast 50% of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination in case of General Category candidates and 45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates.

SUBJECTS OFFERING

Except in the case of Geology and Geography no candidate for the B.Sc. Semester-I examination, under the CBCS, shall take up any subject unless he had taken up same subject in Higher Secondary Part-II of 10+2 pattern or an equivalent examination, provided that a candidate having passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination with-

- (i) A student having studied any of the Biology based subjects in Hr Sec Part II as a subject will be eligible to take up Botany or Zoology or Biotechnology or Sericulture or Fisheries
- (ii) Mathematics and Physics as subjects will be eligible to take up Electronics in the B.Sc.

Semester-I.

- a) No candidate will offer Mathematics/Applied Mathematics/Statistics for B.A./B.Sc. Semester-I Course unless he/she has qualified the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination with Mathematics.
- b) No candidate will be admitted to the B.Com. Semester-I Course unless he/she has passed Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 Pattern) examination with Commerce stream.
- c) Provided that a candidate after having passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination in stream other than Commerce stream with at least 50% marks in the aggregate shall be allowed to seek admission to the B.Com. Semester-I.
- d) No candidate will be admitted to the B.Sc. Home Science stream Semester-lexamination unless the candidate had taken up Home Science stream or Home Science as an elective subject or Science group of subjects in the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 Pattern) examination or an examination recognized equivalent thereto.
- e) A candidate for the B.A./B.Sc. Semester-II, III, IV, V and VI Examinations shall have to opt for the subjects prescribed in the CBCS under the new pattern of courses.

Provided that candidate shall not be allowed to change the stream from Science to Arts, Commerce to Arts or Science/Arts to Commerce. However, the candidate may opt for the Electives and Skill Based Courses prescribed in the CBCS.

- f) In case of B.Com./B.Sc. Home Science stream, a candidate shall have to opt the subjects prescribed for the course by the Academic Council.
- g) No candidate will opt Statistics for B.A./B.Sc. Semester-I unless he/she has qualified the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination with Mathematics/Business Mathematics/ Statistics.

Admission to Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) in the affiliated Colleges under National Education Policy (NEP-2020)

The following instructions are being issued to all the affiliated colleges for admitting students to the Undergraduate Degree Programme under National Education Policy (NEP 2020) during the academic session 2022-23.

Subject Combinations

- Major Course: Any subject in a discipline in which student wants to graduate for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research (Annexure-I).
- Minor Course: Any subject other than major available in the college within same discipline (Amnexure-I).
- Multidisciplinary Course (MD): Any subject of student's choice which is of interdisciplinary nature from faculties other than Major and Minor.

- 5. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Two credits course each from 1st to 3rd semesters. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the University of Jammu. The University Departments/respective Board of Studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.
- Value Added Courses (VAC): Four credits comprising of two courses (oz credits each) in 1st and 2nd semester(s) are compulsory courses.
 - (a) Understanding India
- (b) Environmental Science and Education
- (c) Digital Technology
- (d) Health and Wellness

In addition to the above, there will be two optional courses of two credits each in 3rd and 4th semester(s) out of the following:

- (a) Community Engagement
- (b) National Cadet Corp (NCC)
- (c) National Service Scheme (NSS) (d) Sports
- (e) Cultural

(f) Yoga Education

(These optional courses are to be offered by the college subject to the availability of faculty/infrastructure).

- 7. All the Principals of the degree colleges (Govt. and Private) are requested to ensure that the list of the major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses alongwith intake capacity shall be made available on their website.
- Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admissions. The admission shall be made according to the merit, subject to the seats available in the respective course.
- The eligibility criteria for admission in various disciplines and fee shall be as per the statutes in vogue.







SCHEME OF EXAMINATION/ASSESMENT

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts: Internal or In Semester Assessment (IA) and External or End-Semester Assessment (EA).

The internal grade awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of end semester examination. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the teacher(s) who teaches the course. There will be University Examinations at the end of each semester for both theory and Practical. Semester End Examinations for all theory papers shall be got set/ prepared by the Controller of Examinations as per existing norms and evaluation of all theory papers courses shall be done by eligible faculty members of a cluster of colleges to be formed by all the colleges of a district, under the supervision and coordination of the Controller of Examination. When there is a single college in a district it has the liberty either to join the nearest cluster or form a new cluster with a similarly placed college of an adjacent district. Principal of the college where an evaluation centre shall be established shall prepare the panel of Evaluators and Head Examiners. 5-10% of the answer scripts evaluated by each evaluator may be got revised at random through the Head Examiners, in case of all courses.

20% of the marks allotted to each theory paper and 50% of the marks allotted to each practical paper including field work/ project work/ dissertation, wherever prescribed, shall be reserved for internal assessment. The evaluation of a candidate shall be awarded and record thereof maintained in

accordance with the Regulations prescribed for the purpose under the amended scheme governing CBCS at UG level for the academic session 2017-18 as per the following:

Paper having theoretical content only

- All 6 credits on lecture basis
 Or
- 2. 4 credits on lecture basis plus 2 credits on tutorial basis

Paper having Practical content only

Four credits on theory basis

Plus

Two credits on practical basis

One Credit in case of theory and tutorial is one hour duration for fifteen working days (periods) or 23 periods of 40 minutes duration.

One credit in case of practical is two hour duration for fifteen working days or 45 periods of 40 minutes duration.

Theory Examinations (Modified vide notification no. F.Acd/II/17/512-1642 Dated: 04-05-2017)

- Each theory paper/course shall be of 100 marks.
- ❖ 20% of which shall be reserved for internal assessment.
- 80% of which shall be reserved for External Examinations to be conducted by the University/College.
- The External Examinations in theory shall consist of following
 - 1. Five(5) short answers to the questions representing all units/syllabi, i.e., at least one from each unit (without details explanation) having 70-80 words in approximately 6 minutes and having 3 marks for each answer to the question (All compulsory).
 - 2. Five(5) medium answers to the questions representing all units/syllabi, i.e., at least one from each unit (with explanation) having 250-300 words in approximately 12 minutes and having 7 marks for each answer to the question (All compulsory).
 - 3. Four/Five(4/5) long answers to the questions **(two to be attempted)** representing all units/syllabi, i.e., at least one from each unit with detailed analysis/explanation/critical evaluation/solution to the stated problem within 500-600 words in approximately 30 minutes and having 15 marks for each answer to the question.

Time duration 2^{1/2} hours only.

Internal Assessment

The Internal assessment under Choice Based Credit System shall comprise two parts.

- **Part A:** Total weightage to this part shall be 50% of internal assessment marks, i.e., 10% of the total marks or 10 marks out of 20 marks reserved for internal assessment. It will have eight short questions selecting at least three from each of the two/three units (50% of syllabus) covered. A candidate has to attempt any five and each question carries 2 marks.
- **Part B:** Total weightage to this part shall be 50% of internal assessment marks, i.e., 10% of the total marks or 10 marks out of 20 marks reserved for internal assessment. It will have two Long questions questions selecting one each from first two units (50% of syllabus)

covered. A candidate have attempt any one question and the question shall carry 10 marks.

Time duration one hour.

Note: Total marks in practical shall be 50 only

Total marks in case of project work shall be divided into 80 percent for project work and 20 percent for presentation/Viva Voce

In case of failure/re-appear category the Internal Assessment earned by the candidate as a regular student shall be carried forward to the subsequent examination.

PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER

- (i) A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-I to II, Semester-III to IV if he/she has
 - (a)secured pass marks in Internal Assessment of all the subjects/papers of the Semester-I/III as the case may be.
 - (b) has appeared in at least one of the papers of Semester End examination of SemesterI/III as the case may be.
- (ii) A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-II to III and Semester IV to V provided he/she has earned at least 50% of the total credits for the subjects/papers of theory/practicals of Semester-I/III as the case may be and passed in Internal Assessment of all subjects/papers of Semester-II/IV as the case may be
- (iii) A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-V to VI provided he/she has passed in all subjects/papers of Semester-I and Semester-IIII.

Provided that a student who does not fulfill the promotion criteria (i), (ii) & (iii) above shall be declared fail in the semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured Pass marks.

- (iv) A student who has to reappear in a subject/paper prescribed for Semester-I to IV shall appear in the subsequent Semester end examination to be held as per the dates prescribed by the University.
- (v) A student who has to reappear in a subject(s)/paper(s) prescribed for Semester-V & VI shall appear in the supplementary examination.

Amendment vide Notification no. F.Acd/I/17/6714-6813 Dated: 20-07-2017 of Jammu University

- 9. The eligibility of passing in 50% papers for admission in Semester-V of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)BBA/BCA/Honours Course shall exclude Environmental paper Semester-III.
- 10. The eligibility for admission of students to Semester-III of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General)BBA/BCA/Honours Course under CBCS that stand fixed as passed 50% of the credits, shall be rounded off to nearest lower side where 50% of credits comes to the odd number and no combination /permutation of subjects/papers makes it to that odd number of credits. For example where a course is of 22 credits and 50% of credits id odd (11 credits), the eligibility shall be rounded off to 10 credits.

11. The eligibility condition of passed in internal assessment of at least 75% of subjects/papers of Semester-II/IV of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)BBA/BCA/Honours Course for admission to Semester III & IV respectively under CBCS shall also applicable to the Semester System (Non-CBCS)

CONDONATION OF LECTURES

I The Principal of College concerned may condone shortage of a student in attendance in a semester for special reasons, to be recorded in writing upto 6% of the lectures delivered or practicals conducted in each course separately.

II Any candidate, who falls short of attendance beyond condonable limits or whose shortage in attendance is not condoned by the competent authorities and wants to pursue the programme, shall be required to re-join the course along with the next batch of students of the same class to make up the deficiency by attending the required number of lectures by which he/she had fallen short. This provision shall however, be applicable only in respect of such of the candidates who have attended at least 50% classes in the said course/s. Candidates having attended less than 50% of the lectures in a particular course/s shall be considered for re-admission after depositing afresh the prescribed admission fee for the Semester / Course. However, such candidate/s shall appear in the examination along with the candidates of the semester, with which he/she has been re-admitted, in regular capacity.

Provided further also that in case such a student again falls short of lectures he/she shall not be allowed to seek admission to that course in any affiliated college in any subsequent year.

A student who has been on the rolls of a college in the Semester-I, II,III, IV & V of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA/Honours course and earns eligibility to join the Semester-II or III or IV or V of the programme as the case may be, but fails to join the semester when he/she was due to join it or discontinues his/her studies for any reason whatsoever may be considered for admission to the semester concerned in a subsequent year if he/she submits application to this effect before the commencement of the semester concerned provided a seat and other facilities for the courses offered by the student are available in the college concerned in the semester he/she wishes to join and the student seeks admission within a period of one year from the date he/she discontinue his/her studies.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION AND EXAMINATION

English shall be the medium of instruction and examination in all papers/courses except in Oriental Classical, Modern Indian Languages and Music where the medium of instruction and examination shall be the language concerned

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARANCE IN EXAMINATION

A semester end external examination for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/BBA/BCA/Honours course, under CBCS, shall be open to the following categories of students :

(A)A regular student i.e. a student who has undergone a regular course of study in a college for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the college immediately preceding the examination and has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the

college Principal where he/she has pursued the course for the examination and has fulfilled the following conditions to be certified by the college Principal concerned:

- (i)he/she has been a student of good conduct.
- (ii)he/she has attended not less than 75% of the lecture delivered including seminars, tutorials etc in each course opted by him/her in that semester.
 - (iii)he/she has passed in internal assessment.
- (iv)in the case of laboratory course/practicals, he/she has attended not less than 75% of the practical classes conducted (practicals include field studies, workshop practice, map work, surveying etc.).
 - (v) he/she has paid the prescribed fee.
- **(B)**Ex-students i.e. students who after having undergone a regular course of study and having completed all conditions of eligibility for appearance in a course(s) in a semester examination including minimum attendance requirement and having passed in Internal Assessment and having either failed to pass the semester examination in that subject/paper(s) or been unable to appear in the examination in that subject/paper(s) will be eligible to appear as a private candidate in the examination by submitting his/her application on the prescribed form along with prescribed fees to reach the Controller of Examinations within the dates fixed for this purpose.

INTER-UNIVERSITY MIGRATION

A candidate having remained on the rolls of an affiliated/constituent college who has attended the corresponding programme of semester system in any other recognized University shall be admitted in Semester-III or V of the course after having passed Semester-I and Semester-II/Semester-I to IV of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/BBA/ BCA/Honours course provided the following conditions are fulfilled:—

- (i) migration is not being sought to evade the admission requirements of the University;
- (ii) the courses/programme of study prescribed/pursued by the candidate in the University from which he/she seeks migration are not materially different from the courses/programmes prescribed to be pursued in this University;
- (iii) the candidate would be in a position to satisfy all the statutory requirements prescribed by the University for admission to the programme and appearance in the examination.

Provided that such a candidate who has not qualified the Semester examination with the subjects/combination of subjects for which he/she intends to seek admission to the next higher class of this University shall be required to qualify such subjects of the qualifying examination of this University as may be determined by the University.

The marks/ grades obtained in B.A./B.Sc./ B.Sc (Home Science) / B.Com.General or Honours / BBA/BCA/Honours course Semester-I to V or equivalent examinations conducted by another University from which the candidate has migrated shall be taken into account for determining the final result (by increasing or reducing the marks/grades in accordance with the maximum marks/grades of the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com General or Honours/BBA/BCA/Honours course of this University).

ATTENDANCE IN LIEU OF PARTICIPATION IN GAMES ETC.

Any candidate who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the Principal/Director concerned shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance incurred by him/her on account of such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his/her absence on such account for a period of 15 working days in a semester programme subject to maximum of 30 working days in an year.

- (a) State representation in International/All India Competitions organized by agencies which are recognized by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare.
- (b) Participation in the Inter-University Competitions held under the auspices of a University or any other recognized Institution as a member of the University team.
- (c) Participation in the Inter-College Competitions organized by the University as a member of the team of participating Institutions.
- (d) Participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S. and National Integration Samiti activities as a member of recognized Institutions.
- (e) Participation in the Coaching Camps/Rehearsals prior to participation as a member of State or University team in the National/All India/ Inter- University Competitions.
- (f) Participation in the Mountaineering/Hiking/Trekking/Skiing/Rock-Climbing or other such activities organized under the auspices of the State Government/University as a member of the Institution affiliated/recognized by the University.

Note: For Outstanding cases (requiring attendance waiver due to duty beyond 30 days) special permission may be sought from the Vice Chancellor/Competent Authority on recommendation of the Principal/Director Concerned.

DATES OF SEMESTER END EXAMINATIONS

The semester end examination for Semester-I, III & V, under CBCS, will generally be held in the 2nd week of November every year. The examination for Semester-II, IV & VI, under CBCS, will generally be held in the 2nd week of April every year. However, exact dates and the Centres of examination shall be fixed by the Controller of Examinations. **EXEMPTION TO RE-APPEAR IN PRACTICAL EXAMINATION ONCE QUALIFIED**

A candidate who appears and passes in the practical examination (separately in the internal assessment and the University examination) of a subject but fails to qualify in that subject shall be exempted from appearing in the practical examination of that subject subsequently and the marks obtained by him/her in the last attempt in which he/she passed in the practical examination

of a subject shall be carried over. Consequently, he/she shall be required to appear in the theory part of that subject at the subsequent examination.

RE-APPEAR CATEGORY FOR FAILURES

A candidate who fails in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/BBA/BCA/Honours course Semester-I/II/III/IV/V/VI examination but has secured pass marks, (separately in the internal assessment and the University examination) in a subject or subjects, shall be exempted from appearing in such subject(s) and shall be allowed to appear in the remaining subject(s) in a subsequent examination(s) on payment of prescribed fee on each occasion and if he/she passes in the subject(s) he/she shall be declared to have passed the examination.

Provided that re-appear/failure candidates shall have to appear in the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General)/BBA/BBA(Honours)/BCAcourse Semester-I/II/III/IV/V/VI examination (as the case may be) as per the syllabi in vogue and fulfillment of other statutory conditions.

Provided that the examination shall be completed within six years from the date of his/her admission in Semester-I.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

There shall be supplementary examination for the Semester-V & VI only

RESULT IMPROVEMENT

- 1. A candidate who has passed the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/ BBA/BBA(Honours)/BCA/Honours course examination from the University of Jammu and has been placed in the B Grade in the aggregate of all the semester examinations shall be given one chance to improve his/her grade within a period of two years of having passed the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/ BBA/BCA/Honours course examination and for this purpose he/she shall appear as a private candidate in the consecutive examinations in any number of courses except Practicals, field work, surveys, viva-voce etc. The credits already earned by the candidate in other courses in which he/she does not appear shall be carried forward. The result of such a candidate shall be declared if he/she improves the grade.
- 2. Reappearance in Practical examination shall not be allowed.
- 3. A student who appears in a paper shall carry forward the internal assessment Grades originally awarded.

Notwithstanding anything contained above, a candidate, who having passed the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/BBA/BCA/Honours course examination in B Grade from the University of Jammu, appears in the examination to improve the Grades but fails to do so, his/her result may also be declared provided he/she retains earlier grade or achieves higher grade.

Such a candidate shall have to return to the University the Graduation Degree and transcripts of all semester examinations, in original, if issued to him/her. The certificates will be returned to him/her if he/she fails to improve his/her result under the above provisions.

PASSING CRITERION

The minimum Grade /Grade Point required to pass each paper in a semester examination under CBCS shall be **Grade D** / **Grade Point 4** in each theory paper/ Practical/Project (wherever applicable) in External Examination and Internal Assessment separately

DETERMINATION OF GRADES (Grading System and Computation of SGPA, CGPA)

Grading System: Absolute grading would be used where the marks obtained are converted to grades based on pre-determined class intervals. To implement the following grading system, the colleges /campuses shall use the following UGC recommended 10-point grading system:

(i) A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear

in the examination as per existing rules of the university under Semester System for Under Graduate Courses.

(ii) Grade(D) or percentage of marks (36%) is required to pass in a course, SGPA of 4 to qualify a semester and a minimum CGPA of 4 to qualify for a UG degree.

Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The following procedure shall be used to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

- (i) The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e **SGPA** (Si) = Σ (Ci x Gi) / Σ Ci ,where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.
 - (ii) The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e. **CGPA** = $\Sigma(\text{Ci x Si}) / \Sigma$ Ci where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.
 - (iii) The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

RE-EVALUATION OF ANSWER SCRIPTS

- (i)Re-evaluation of answer scripts of semester end external examination shall be permissible in each course of a Semester examination of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA/Honours as per the University statutes.
- (ii)Re-evaluation shall not be permitted in the practical, internal assessment, project report, dissertation, thesis & viva-voce etc.
 - (iii) Re-evaluation shall not be permissible for candidates connected with improvement of Grades.

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
